ER/LA Opioid REMS: Achieving Safe Use While Improving Patient Care

Practicing physicians like you often struggle to manage their patients' pain. Extended-release (ER) and long-acting (LA) opioids are a valuable element of the pain management plan for some patients. Unfortunately, the misuse and abuse of ER/LA opioids have resulted in a serious public health crisis of addiction, overdose, and death. Clinicians must play a role in prevention.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has announced a risk evaluation and mitigation strategy (REMS) for ER/LA opioid products. This REMS course will be offered at the 2015 MOMA Primary Care Roundup.

The course provides 3.0 AOA Category 1-A CME credit(s). Prescribers who attend the 3-session and take the assessment, which covers the entire U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) Blueprint, will be considered RPC/FDA completers.

- Be familiar with how to initiate therapy, modify dose, and discontinue use of ER/LA opioids
- Know how to manage ongoing therapy with ER/LA opioids

- Be familiar with the general and product-specific drug information concerning ER/LA opioids
