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The Laboratory
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Test Clarification

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A review of the peripheral blood smear by a pathologist is an important and essential component in both clinical and laboratory settings. This practice can result in a more timely diagnosis, better-quality laboratory data, and improved patient management.

Laboratory Services has two options for a Path Review, 1) Path Review, QA and 2) Path Review, Physician Ordered. There are significant differences between the two such as who can order each and which has a charge associated with it.

Path Review, QA

This can be ordered by an in-house technologist or an outlying client's technical staff as a "Quality" review of a peripheral smear originating from a manual differential or smear review. The Pathologist's Review comments will be entered into Cerner. There is no additional charge to the patient.

The Criteria for a Path Review QA:

- 1. Pancytopenia
- 2. Abnormal inclusions in any cell type, including parasites
- 3. WBC > 40.000/ml
- 4. Absolute Lymphocytosis > 5000 mm3
- 5. Lymphocytes > 80 %
- 6. Monocytes > 3000 mm3
- 7. Eosinophils > 20 %
- 8. Absolute basophilia (>200 mm3)
- 9. Variant lymphs >15 %
- 10 .Metamyelocytes + Myelocytes >5%
- 11. Promyelocytes
- Abnormal cells, including blasts, abnormal lymphoid cells, unidentified cells, dysplastic cells of any lineage and megakaryocytes
- 13. Abnormal red cell indices including nRBC's, rouleaux, schistocytes, spherocytes, and marked abnormal MCV or RDW



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Specimen and Information Requirements:

- 1. CBC results or printout
- 2. Clinical information, i.e.: patient history, diagnosis or DX codes
- 3. 2 well-made unstained blood smears
- 4. Original EDTA specimen tube

NOTE:

- ➤ If the patient has had a Pathologist Review performed within the last 6 months and the slide is consistent with the previous Path Review, a comment will be placed in Cerner that states: "Please refer to prior Path Review from date"."
- ➤ Path Reviews must be seen by a Pathologist every 6 months unless there is a significant change, and then they will be reviewed sooner.

Path Review, Physician Ordered

This is available to "physicians only" and is for instances when the physician specifically wants a blood smear reviewed by a Pathologist. This request is processed as a histology request incurring the appropriate charges. A dictated pathology report will be returned to the requesting physician.

In addition to the requirements for a Path Review QA we <u>must</u> have the patient billing information.

Test Discontinued

Clostridium difficile Toxin A + B, stool

Effective June 3, 2015, this test was discontinued. The only C. *difficle* testing that will be available to order is the CDIFF, GDH. A positive GDH test will reflex to the C. *difficile*, PCR. The GDH assay was featured in the April 2015 issue of the Laboratory Communiqué.
